## **Preparing Your Painting For An Exhibit**

These tips have been given before and are listed on our web page, but people are forgetting to follow them and hanging paintings is becoming difficult because people are not following these simple rules.

- 1. Make sure your frame is sturdy and clean.
- 2. Be sure you have your art work secured well onto the mat.
- 3. When putting the wire onto the back of the art work place the wire holders within the top third of the picture frame. Then wrap the wire through the holes and twist the wire six or seven times and cover it with masking tape. If possible get some small, clear tubing at the hardware store. Cut the tubing about an inch and a half and slide it over the twisted wire on each end. That way no one will be hurt from the frayed wires.
- 4. Make sure the glass is very clean on both sides and there is no debris between the glass, mat or picture.
- 5. Make sure the back of the painting is as neat as it can be. People do look at this when they are buying.
- 6. If you have to stack your paintings when moving them place them back to back or front to front. Put a towel or cardboard between them for safety.
- 7. Always carry them by the wire or with two hands by the sides and not just one side. If not the frames become weak and loosen and can fall apart.
- 8. Inexpensive pinch clamp frames should be avoided as they are difficult to hang properly.
